I. Introduction to Disciplines and Main Research Fields

CEIBS is a non-profit joint venture established by Shanghai Government and the European Union (EU) under an agreement between the Ministry of Foreign Trade and Economic Cooperation (MOFTEC, now called The Ministry of Commerce) and the European Commission. As a professional Higher Educational Institute for training international senior management leaders, CEIBS launched the first full-English teaching full-time MBA program, and EMBA and Executive Education programs on the Chinese mainland. With the approval of Shanghai Jiao Tong University, CEIBS officially began a PhD program in 2015. Up to April 2015, CEIBS has more than 16,000 alumni across China and around the world, among which 52% are from EMBA, 21% from MBA, 1% from FMBA, and 26% from Executive Education. CEIBS has also provided management training to more than 100,000 Executives.

CEIBS' faculty and research staff is currently concentrated in five subject areas: Economics/Decision Science, Finance/Accounting, Strategy and Entrepreneurship, Organizational Behavior and Human Resource Management, and Marketing.
